Such innocents of course never purchased a book themselves, probably they never read one, at least not a book of any substance.

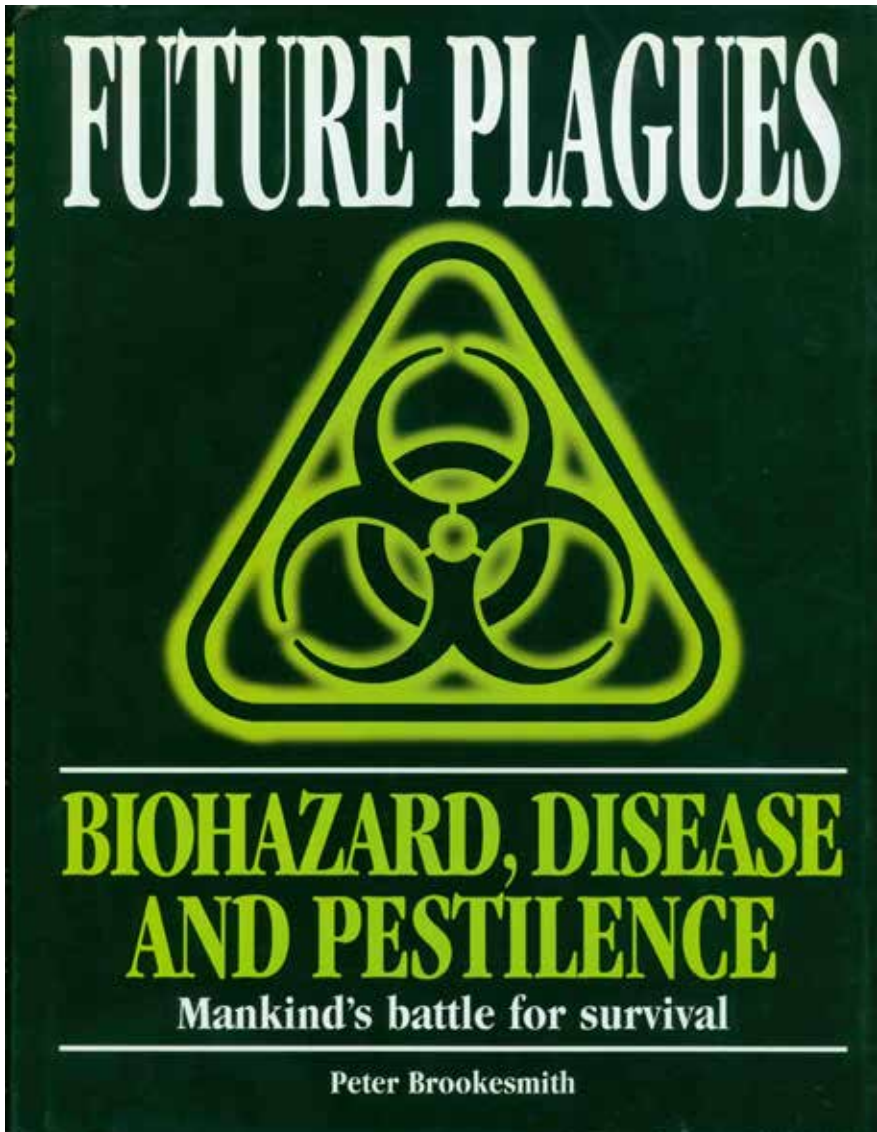
However, on this occasion, the rejoinder is nearly true. In the list here offered, I have indeed read all but two (and one, I confess, only partially) more or less in chronological order. I have learned a lot, and sadly I am not surprised at the resurgence of COVID-19 in Europe and elsewhere — it is following the pattern of many epidemics throughout history. I think the common factor is human behaviour. With all our modern technology and sophistication, vastly greater access to information and speed of communications, human beings still behave in essentially primitive ways. We get impatient, we get bored, we don't like being told what to do, we crave the company of our fellows, and the virus cares not, but implacably follows its trajectory and takes advantage of every opportunity.

I found these books very interesting and informative, with a high proportion being well-written and engaging. I hope you may find the same.

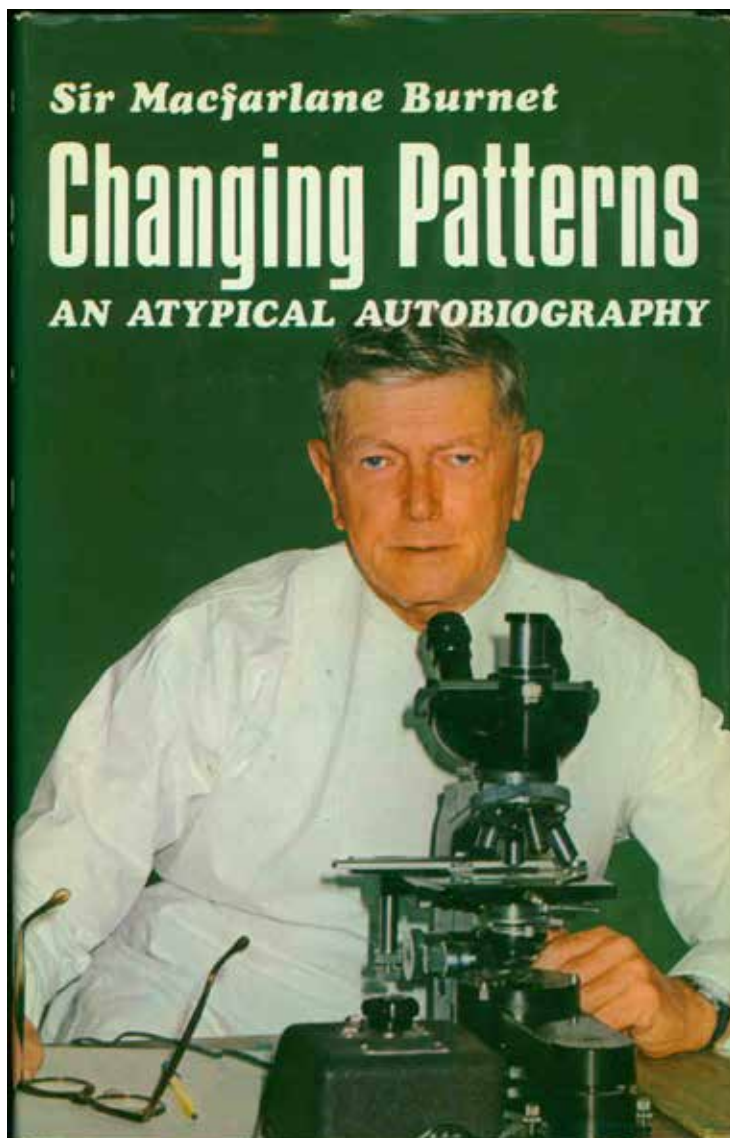
